RULES, REGULATIONS & POLICIES

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: Show management reserves the right to combine, split, cancel, limit or move classes and divisions as entries warrant, which could mean divisions may change days on which they run or rings in which they are held. Classes may not necessarily be run in the order listed in the class lists. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the show secretary of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule. Management reserves the right to change officials, limit entries or divisions, combine or cancel classes, modify the schedule, and to modify or cancel awards and/or make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein. Show Management reserves the right to cancel classes insufficiently filled and to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed sufficient by Show Management. Changes will be posted in the Facebook event, sent via email to the email on the entry form and posted in the show office. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; its decision to be final.

TREATMENT OF HORSES: Show Management will enforce the fair and humane treatment for all horses participating in the Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.) Championships.

PARTICIPATING RIDER CODE OF CONDUCT: The Jockey Club (TJC) expects appropriate behavior from all riders, trainers, spectators and others participating in any TJC event. Inappropriate behavior may include, but is not limited to: possession, use or distribution of any illegal drugs; profanity, vulgar language or gestures; harassment (i.e., using words or actions that intimidate, threaten or persecute others before, during or following The Jockey Club activities); failure to follow rules; and abusing a horse. Reports of inappropriate code of conduct may be made at any time to the Show Manager. Any verbal or physical act of discourtesy toward a judge, show official, volunteer, show staff or staff member on the part of a trainer, owner, rider, handler, groom, family member or person associated with an entry is a violation of the Code of Conduct. Persons found by Show Management to be in violation of this Code of Conduct will be unable to participate in the remainder of the show, will forfeit all fees and awards from previous classes and divisions, and will be ineligible to show at the T.I.P. Championships in 2021 and/or future years.

COGGINS TEST: South Carolina state law requires that each horse be accompanied by a negative EIA certificate dated within one year.

ENTRIES: The closing date for entries is September 29, 2021. All entries at www.evententries.com. After the closing date, all stall fees are non-refundable. The entry form must include all mandatory signatures, including legal guardian in the case of a minor exhibiting.

STALLS: Permanent 12 X 12 stalls of wood/metal construction with doors are available during the event at a cost of \$200 per horse/pony. Stalls will be assigned on a first come, first served basis.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES/GOLF CARTS: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single-wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

MINOR EXHIBITORS: Parent(s) or guardian(s) of minor exhibitors shall hold Stable View, The Jockey Club, Horse Show Management and the Facility harmless for any injury to such minor. No child's entry will be accepted or number issued unless entry is signed by a parent or LEGAL guardian. The signature of unrelated persons WILL NOT be accepted.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: Protective headgear, properly secured, must be worn BY ALL RIDERS AT ALL TIMES WHILE MOUNTED, anywhere, anytime on the show grounds. All riders under the age of 18 must wear a helmet at all times, even in Western Pleasure classes. Headgear for all riders must meet or exceed ASTM Standards; must carry the SEI tag; and be properly secured by a harness.

NON-SHOWING HORSES: All non-showing horses must complete an entry blank and be assigned a back number. A \$50 fee will be assessed to any horse not entered in any classes. Stall fee applies. Non-showing horses are not permitted in competition rings at any time.

RIBBONS, PRIZES AND PRIZE MONEY

- In-Hand Championships: Class ribbons 1st through 10th place and prize to each class winner. Prizes, sashes and prize money for In-Hand Championships through 5th place, all prize money payouts based on Championship placement (\$150, \$100, \$75, \$50, \$35).
- Championships Divisions: Class ribbons 1st through 10th place. Prizes, sashes and prize money for Divisions through 10th place, all prize money payouts based on division placement. \$2,000 in prize money per Division with payouts (based on division placement) of: \$600, \$440, \$300, \$200, \$140, \$120, and \$50 each 7th through 10th place.

All prize money won at the Championships will be mailed to the winner following the event. Completed prize money certificates will be included in division placement bags or can be picked up from the show office. Leave all completed prize money certificates with the show secretary or mail it after the show to The Jockey Club T.I.P., 821 Corporate Dr., Lexington, KY 40503.

For Dressage: High Point (Junior, AA, TAA) will be based on the best single test per horse/rider combination. Champion and Reserve Champion will be based on the average of the three tests.

For CT: High Point (Junior, AA, TAA) is given to highest placed eligible horse in each Division. Champion and Reserve Champion will be based on the horse's placing in the CT division.

DOGS: Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Failure to maintain your dog, under control, as defined here, will result in a \$100 fine assessed to the owner. In addition, pursuant to facility regulations, loose dogs will be removed by animal control, from the show grounds, at the owner's expense and impounded.

ELECTRICAL/FIRE REGULATIONS: All electrical installation and connections must meet all state and county codes. Aisles shall be maintained clear for a minimum of six (6) feet wide by eight (8) feet high. No obstructions or projections shall be allowed in these aisles. No Class I Flammable liquids such as gasoline are allowed inside the buildings. Cooking is not permitted within the stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to dismissal from further participation in the horse show without recourse.

PARKING: Fire regulations prohibit all vehicles, including trailers, vans and passenger vehicles from being parked in the stable areas. Vans and trailers will be allowed in the stable area only to load or off-load. PARKING AREAS WILL BE DESIGNATED AND VIOLATORS WILL BE TOWED AT OWNERS EXPENSE

RING SIZES:

- All rings and warmups are sand/poly-fiber mixture
- 300 ft. x 250 ft. Covered arena (The Covered) – all schooling, in hand classes
- 300 ft. x 250 ft. Outdoor arena (The Outdoor) - Jumper
- 220 ft. x 120 ft. Dressage arena (Silva Arena) - Pleasure
- 150 ft. x 200 ft. arena (Hunter Arena) – Hunter
- 330 ft. x 230 ft. arena– Dressage (2 rings)

LIABILITY: The Jockey Club, Stable View Equestrian Center, their officials and employees will not be responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectators, guest, rider, groom, attendant, other employees, animals, or equipment at the events. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, their horses, or their dogs. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events, and to keep that policy up to date.

PHOTO RELEASE: By signing the entry form I agree to waive the right of use of my photos/videos at the competition and grant The Jockey Club and Stable View Equestrian Center and its agent's full use of any and all competition photos and video.

ATTIRE: Proper attire please.

EQUIPMENT: No martingales permitted in flat classes. No equine wraps or bell boots of any kind permitted in hunter or in-hand classes. Braiding not required.

DRESSAGE RULES: Dressage classes will be conducted under 2020 USEF Dressage and USEF Western Dressage rules unless otherwise noted by Show Management or in these Rules. Whips are not permitted in Championships classes. All tests may be read in all classes.

DRUGS AND MEDICATION – Current USEF rules relating to drugs and medications will be enforced.

Fees:

- Entry Fee: \$200 per horse for first division; \$100 per horse for an additional division
*NO extra office or grounds fees! All included in your entry fee!
**First Division fee also includes one entry in the In-Hand classes.
- Stall Fee: \$200 per stall. Includes competition days plus one day arrival (October 7) and one day departure (October 11). Stall fee includes full access to all training facilities at Stable View excluding the cross country course and the Boyd Martin ETB Schooling Field.
 - Paddocks available for rent for \$50 per paddock.
 - Bedding is NOT provided. Shavings will be available for sale on grounds during the competition.
 - Hay is not available.
 - To purchase shavings, contact the Stable View office info@stableviewfarm.com
- Non-Competing Horses: \$50 per horse (same stall fee applies) [Non competition horses not permitted in competition rings]
- Refunds: Before entries close, entries for classes will be refunded less a \$25 processing fee. After entries have closed, entries for classes will be refunded only upon presentation of a vet certificate pronouncing the horse unfit to show. If a horse is deemed unfit to show, the stall fee (\$200) will not be refunded and that entry will endure a scratch fee of \$25, for a total of \$225.
- Payment – Payment is required at time of entry.

GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS

1. T.I.P. Championships are open only to qualified and declared Thoroughbreds. A "Thoroughbred" is defined as any horse that has been registered with The Jockey Club (TJC) or a foreign Thoroughbred stud book recognized by TJC.
2. Each division is open only to horses that qualified and declared for that division.
 - a. **Qualifying:** To qualify for the Championships, a T.I.P.-eligible Thoroughbred must
 - i. Participate in a show offering T.I.P. high point awards, classes or divisions beginning August 1, 2020 through September 5, 2021; or
 - ii. Participate in Take2 divisions beginning August 1, 2020 through September 5, 2021;
 - iii. Be entered in the 2021 RRP Mega Makeover; or
 - iv. Have been qualified and declared for the 2020 T.I.P. Championships; or
 - v. Have participated in the 2020 T.I.P. Performance Awards; or
 - vi. Have been accepted through a Hardship Request.All qualifications must be in the applicable discipline. To qualify, horses can be shown in any Hunter, Jumper, Western or English Pleasure classes or divisions or any Dressage, Western Dressage or Combined Test classes at the show offering T.I.P. awards. Horses shown at a horse trial or combined test may also qualify for show jumping or dressage (as applicable). Virtual and online horse shows are not eligible for qualification.
 - b. **Declaring:** After qualifying, owners and riders must declare their horse for the Championships by submitting a Horse Declaration Form.
 - c. **Hardship Requests:** Hardship requests to qualify for Championships will be considered ONLY for Thoroughbreds that are being shown during the Championship year, but were not able to attend a show with T.I.P. Awards and did not participate in the Performance Awards. A Thoroughbred must attend a MINIMUM of two shows during the Championship year and must have been shown at the height or level being requested at one of those shows in order to be considered for a Hardship Request. To request qualification via a hardship request, you must submit a Hardship Declaration Form AND (i) a statement explaining in less than 500 words why you are not able to access shows with T.I.P. awards and (ii) a brief show record covering the Championship year, including show name, date, division, height jumped and any other relevant information. You must submit the Hardship statement by September 6, 2021.

3. In-Hand Championships offers \$500 in prize money plus prizes. Each T.I.P. Championship Division offers \$2,000 in prize money plus prizes.
4. High Point AA and Junior awards will be awarded in every Division except the Pleasure Divisions and In-Hand.
 - a. Junior – riders 18 years of age and under as of 12/1/20.
 - b. AA –Adult Amateurs only. For details on what constitutes Amateur status, please visit www.usef.org.
5. Cross-Entering: Each horse may only be entered in up to two (2) Championship Divisions total (across all disciplines). Horses must be qualified and declared for both divisions. Management reserves the right to limit, combine, split or cancel divisions. Horses limited to three dressage tests per day (this includes tests for CT). Each horse may only be entered in one in-hand class.
6. Cross-entering within the same discipline (Hunter, Jumper) (i) with the same rider must be at consecutive heights and (ii) with a different rider must be at consecutive heights unless a dispensation is requested and granted.
7. Horses limited to 4 O/F classes per day
8. Special, Handy and Challenge class winners receive special prize.
9. Jump Height: For jumping divisions, the horse may be entered at or above the lowest height jumped during the Championship year.
10. Dressage Level: For Dressage, each horse may entered at or above the lowest level competed during the Championship year.

IN-HAND CHAMPIONSHIPS SPECIFICATIONS

General: Horse should be presented in a bridle. Each horse may only be entered in one in-hand class. Entry for One (1) in-hand class included with your Championship Division entry. Will be judged on conformation and way of going at a walk and trot in hand. Minor blemishes and faults not considered. Winner of each Class #1 – #8 will be entered in the \$500 In-Hand Championship, judged after the conclusion of class #8.

1. War Horse In-Hand (won over \$100,000) – Open to Thoroughbreds that have won over \$100,000.
2. War Horse In-Hand (more than 50 starts) – Open to Thoroughbreds that raced over 50 times.
3. In-Hand 6yo and over Mares – Open to Thoroughbred mares 6 years of age or older (age as of January 1, 2021)
4. In-Hand 2yo to 5yo Fillies/Mares – Open to Thoroughbred fillies and mares 2 to 5 years of age (age as of January 1, 2021)
5. In-Hand 6yo and over Geldings/Stallions – Open to Thoroughbred geldings and stallions 6 years of age or older (age as of January 1, 2021)
6. In-Hand 2yo to 5yo Geldings/Colts – Open to Thoroughbred geldings and stallions 2 to 5 years of age (age as of January 1, 2021)
7. TAA/TCA Aftercare Organization Graduate In-Hand (Gelding) – Open to Thoroughbred geldings adopted from a 2021 Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance accredited organization (see thoroughbredaftercare.org/taa-accredited-organizations/) or a Thoroughbred Charities of America Thoroughbred Rehabilitation, Retraining, Rehoming and Retirement Grantee (see tca.org/rescue-grantees/).
8. TAA/TCA Aftercare Organization Graduate In-Hand (Mare) – Open to Thoroughbred mares adopted from a 2021 Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance accredited organization (see thoroughbredaftercare.org/taa-accredited-organizations/) or a Thoroughbred Charities of America Thoroughbred Rehabilitation, Retraining, Rehoming and Retirement Grantee (see tca.org/rescue-grantees/).

HUNTER DIVISION SPECIFICATIONS

Saturday, October 9, 2021 & Sunday, October 10, 2021

Each Hunter Division consists of 3 O/F classes and 1 U/S class.

- Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over approximately eight fences at the required height. To be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise noted.
- Hunter Over Fences Handy - Course may include, but is not limited to, halt on course, trot fence, roll back, negotiating natural obstacles, bending line, bounce or a fence jumped in a direct line to/from the in gate. etc.
- Hunter Under Saddle - To be shown at a walk, trot and canter. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. May be asked to hand gallop at the discretion of the judge, but no more than eight horses to gallop at one time. Martingales not permitted. Crossrails, Very Green, and Beginning Divisions will not be asked to gallop.

Hunter courses will simulate fences found in the hunting field such as brush, wall, in-and-out, oxer, post and rails, gate, aiken, bank, coop and panels. Management reserves the right to adjust fence heights or spreads as competition warrants.

Judging for all Hunter sections: To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability to count. Horses are not required to jog for soundness.

- 500. Crossrails Championship Division [5001, 5002, 5003, 5004 (U/S)] – Trotting is permissible. Fence height 18”.
- 501. Very Green Hunter Championship Division [5011, 5012, 5013, 5014 (U/S)] – Trotting is permissible. Fence height 2’0”
- 502. Beginning Hunter Championship Division [5021, 5022, 5023, 5024 (U/S)] – Fence height 2’3”
- 503. Special Hunter Championship Division [5031, 5032, 5033, 5034 (U/S)] – Fence height 2’6”
- 504. Suitable Hunter Championship Division [5041, 5042, 5043, 5044 (U/S)] – Fence height 2’9”
- 505. Low Hunter Championship Division [5051, 5052, 5053, 5054 (U/S)] – Fence height 3’0”

PLEASURE DIVISION SPECIFICATIONS

- 506. Senior English Pleasure Championship Division [5061, 5062, 5063, 5064, 5065]
 - a. English Pleasure W/T – Judged on manners and way of going at the walk and trot.
 - b. English Pleasure W/T/C – Judged on manners and way of going at the walk, trot and canter.
 - c. English Pleasure Thoroughbred Hack and W/T/C Special– Judged on the Thoroughbred's suitability as a pleasure mount, manners and way of going at the walk, trot and canter. Judge will evaluate turnout and may inquire as to race history, with minor blemishes and faults not considered. May be asked to extend trot, halt, turn on the forehand or back.
- 507. Junior English Pleasure Championship Division [5071, 5072, 5073, 5074, 5075]
 - a. English Pleasure W/T – Judged on manners and way of going at the walk and trot.
 - b. English Pleasure W/T/C – Judged on manners and way of going at the walk, trot and canter.
 - c. English Pleasure Thoroughbred Hack and W/T/C Special– Judged on the Thoroughbred's suitability as a pleasure mount, manners and way of going at the walk, trot and canter. Judge will evaluate turnout and may inquire as to race history, with minor blemishes and faults not considered. May be asked to extend trot, halt, turn on the forehand or back.
- 508. Senior Western Pleasure Championship Division [5081, 5082, 5083, 5084, 5085]
 - a. Western Walk/Jog – To be shown both ways of the ring at the walk and jog. May be asked to back per judge's discretion. To be judged on the Western horse's obedience and suitability as a pleasure mount.
 - b. Western Walk/Jog/Lope and W/J/L Special – To be shown both ways of the ring at the walk, jog and lope. May be asked to back per judge's discretion. Judged on the Western horse's way of going and manners at the walk, jog and lope.
 - c. Western Ranch Rail – To be shown individually at the walk, jog and lope both directions of the ring. Horses may be asked to back. To be judged on manners, suitability of horse to rider and performance.

509. Junior Western Pleasure Championship Division [5091, 5092, 5093, 5094, 5095]
- a. Western Walk/Jog – To be shown both ways of the ring at the walk and jog. May be asked to back per judge's discretion. To be judged on the Western horse's obedience and suitability as a pleasure mount.
 - b. Western Walk/Jog/Lope and W/J/L Special – To be shown both ways of the ring at the walk, jog and lope. May be asked to back per judge's discretion. Judged on the Western horse's way of going and manners at the walk, jog, and lope.
 - c. Western Ranch Rail – To be shown individually at the walk, jog and lope both directions of the ring. Horses may be asked to back. To be judged on manners, suitability of horse to rider and performance.

JUMPER DIVISION SPECIFICATIONS

Saturday, October 9, 2021 & Sunday, October 10, 2021

All Jumper Divisions consist of 4 O/F classes. Courses may consist of any combination of the following: brush; gates; oxers; post and rails; water; liver-pool; ditch; wall; banks; panels; or coops.

510. Hopeful Jumper 2'6" Championship Division [5101 (IV – optimum time), 5102 (IV), 5103 (IV), 5104 (II. 2(b))]
511. Suitable Jumper 2'9" Championship Division [5111 (IV – optimum time), 5112 (IV), 5113 (IV), 5114 (II. 2(b))]
512. Schooling Jumper 3'0" Championship Division [5121 (II.1), 5122 (II.2(c)), 5123 (II.1), 5124 (II. 2(b))]

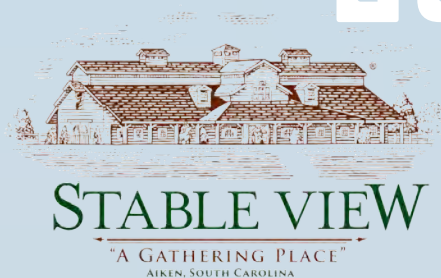
