**Additional Comments or Fees:**

**Show Pass Fees:** Any rider, handler, driver, or owner are limited to one Show Pass purchase annually (Dec. 1 – Nov. 30). USEF Show Pass will be available for purchase by exhibitors on-line only. Competitions cannot accept payment for Show Pass fees. Individuals, including parents who are signing as trainer on behalf of a minor, who are participating as a trainer or coach are not eligible for Show Pass and must obtain a Senior Competing membership to participate in a USEF licensed competition.

Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules).

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes

Veterinary and Health Requirements: Flu and Rhino (EHV 1 &amp; EHV4) within 6 months of show date per GR844 and Coggins within 1 year of show date.

Out of state horses must have a 30-day Interstate Health Certificate

Competition management may fine any individual up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

Food available on site.

**Dog Policy:** Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be held on a leash or otherwise contained at all times. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses, or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Failure to maintain your dog under control, as defined here, will result in a \$100 fine assessed to the owner. In addition, pursuant to facility regulations, loose dogs will be removed from the show grounds by Animal Control, at the owner's expense and impounded. **MOTORIZED VEHICLES/GOLF CARTS:** Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

**PARKING:** Fire regulations prohibit all vehicles, including trailers, vans and passenger vehicles from being parked in stable areas. Vans and trailers will be allowed in the stable area only to load or off-load. **PARKING AREAS WILL BE DESIGNATED AND VIOLATORS WILL BE TOWED AWAY AT OWNER'S EXPENSE.**

**ANIMAL WELFARE:** We require that all horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and should never be subject to mistreatment. Owners, trainers, riders, and grooms or their agents must use reasonable care in the handling and treatment of their horses whether owned or placed in their care for competition or for any other purpose. At all times, while the horse is on the show grounds, we will provide for the continuous well-being of the horse. No excessive use of the whip will be tolerated. The well-being of the horse must be considered above the demands of the breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers, organizers, sponsors or officials.

**IN THE EVENT OF AN ACUTE AND SERIOUS INJURY TO OR ILLNESS OF A HORSE ON COMPETITION GROUNDS WHEN THE OWNER OR TRAINER OF THE HORSE OR AGENT OF THE OWNER IS NOT PRESENT, AFTER REASONABLE EFFORT TO CONTACT THAT INDIVIDUAL HAS BEEN MADE, COMPETITION MANAGEMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH A LICENSED EQUINE VETERINARIAN, MAY AUTHORIZE THE PROVISION OF EMERGENCY VETERINARY TREATMENT OF THE HORSE. IF COMPETITION MANAGEMENT SO AUTHORIZES TREATMENT UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THIS RULE, COMPETITION MANAGEMENT AND VETERINARIAN ARE NOT LIABLE FOR ANY RESULTING COSTS, DAMAGES, LOSSES, CLAIM OR ACTIONS ARISING DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY FROM THE TREATMENT OF THE HORSE.**

**ELECTRICAL/FIRE REGULATIONS:** All electrical installation and connections must meet all state and county codes. Aisles will be maintained clear for a minimum of six (6) feet wide by eight (8) feet high. No obstructions or projections shall be allowed in the aisles. No Class 1 Flammable liquids such as gasoline are allowed inside the buildings. Cooking is not permitted within the stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to dismissal from further participation in the horse show without recourse.

**Stabling Security:** There will be restricted access to the facility during non-competition and non-restaurant hours.
